

Process

The process of developing a strategic plan involves translating that which is strategic to operational. On October 9, 2014 Dr. Philip Heery, Dr. Judith DeStefano, and Dr. Frank Kasyan will facilitate the initial strategic planning meeting for the Manasquan School District. Please come out and join us. We will be meeting at 6:00pm in the High School Media Center.

The strategic planning process involves the creation of a Strategic Planning Team charged with a focus of describing the concept of what the Manasquan School district will become; creating or revising a mission statement, setting organizational goals, developing beliefs, and establishing a future vision.

Action Teams will be formed as a subset of the Strategic Planning Team to create operational plans to realize the strategy. The Action Teams serve as advisory design teams making recommendations to the Strategic Planning Team, which will make recommendations to the Board of Education.

- Moving to Action.
- Action Plan Writing.
- Cost-benefit Analysis.
