The Program and Its Purpose

The Friendly Sons of St. Patrick Foundation has established this Grant Program to reward academic excellence and need of sons and daughters of Irish heritage in Monmouth and Ocean counties.

Administration of the Program

All phases of the grant competition, including selection of the winners and determination of the amount of the grant awards, are managed by a committee of the Friendly Sons of St. Patrick of the Jersey Shore, a non-profit, tax exempt organization.

Conditions of Eligibility

Applicant must:

1. Be a senior residing in Monmouth/Ocean counties, New Jersey and be of Irish heritage.
2. Plan to attend an accredited college, university, or vocational-technical school.

The Application Procedure

Application must:

1. Be certain he or she meets the qualifications described in this brochure.
2. Complete and sign the application.
3. Give the application to a school official who will provide an appraisal and a transcript.
4. Return all application materials postmarked no later than March 17th to: Chairman Grant Committee, Friendly Sons of St. Patrick Foundation, PO Box 254, Spring Lake, New Jersey 07762

The Selection Process

The Grant Committee has total responsibility for selecting the award winners on the basis of the student's academic record, participation in school and community activities, work experience, unusual personal or family circumstances, and an applicant appraisal.

The Foundation receives the applications, makes the selection of award recipients, and determines the amount of the awards.

The Academic Awards

Up to ten awards of \$1,000 each will be provided.

Announcement and Distribution of Awards

Award winners will be notified of their status on or about May 15. The award checks will be mailed directly to the recipient's home as soon as the Grant Committee receives notification that the student will matriculate at a specific institution.

The Responsibilities of the Student

Applicants to the Foundation Grant Program should remember that it is their responsibility to fulfill these requirements:

1. Gather and submit the information necessary for the Foundation Grant as described in their brochure.
2. Apply for admission to college, university or vocational technical school.
3. Be accepted to the institution of their choice.

Obligation

No obligation of any kind will be imposed upon award winners by the Foundation. Further, the Foundation assumes no obligation in connection with the granting of the awards. However, the Foundation reserves the right to alter or discontinue the program at any time.

Notes:

1. Award recipients will be asked to notify the Foundation of acceptance of the award by June 1.
2. The student is solely responsible for returning the complete application and a current and official transcript to the Foundation postmarked no later than March 17th.
