At the University of Dayton, we challenge our students to connect scholarship and learning with leadership and service, developing individuals into servant leaders.

To honor this mission, we are pleased to offer you the opportunity to select one graduating senior to be named the Leadership in Service Scholarship recipient from your school. This scholarship is worth \$10,000 (\$2,500 per year for four years).

While the chosen student needs to meet our admission standards, the scholarship does not need to be awarded based on GPA and test scores. Last year, over 130 students from 30 states were admitted to the University as part of the Leadership in Service program.

To notify us of your selection, simply return the enclosed form, along with the student's transcripts, in the envelope provided by February 15, 2012. The Leadership in Service Scholarship will be included on the recipient's financial aid award letter, which will be mailed in late March.
