THE EARLY COLLEGE PROGRAM What is it?

- It is a unique high school experience
- The program awards students a high school diploma and an Associate of Arts Social Science degree in four years.
- Students follow a prescribed rigorous curriculum taught at MHS & BBC
- Students concurrently complete coursework offered by Brookdale Community College and Manasquan School
 - freshman and sophomores attend Manasquan High School where our teachers who have been approved as adjunct professors teach Brookdale courses
 - juniors spend part of their day at the high school fulfilling their high school requirements; they travel to Brookdale at Wall, 800 Monmouth Blvd for their college courses
 - seniors complete any necessary graduation requirements; they take the college courses at Brookdale Lincroft Campus, 765 Newman Springs Rd

BROOKDALE COMMUNITY COLLEGE FEE SCHEDULE

The upcoming tuition rate (this includes the 2018 Summer III, 2018 Eall, 2019 Winterim, 2019 Spring, and 2019 Summer I.8 II Terms) is \$138.00 per credit. The General Services Fee is \$35.88 per credit; total cost per credit is \$173.88. The table below is provided for easy reference for the cost of up to 15 credits (In-County).
