Should players accused of steroid use be allowed in the Hall of Fame?

In recent years it has been widely known that some MLB players have been accused and have admitted to using steroids. Most of that population is well known, record-breaking, hall of fame potential, players. Players that include the likes of Barry Bonds, Mark McGwire, Rafael Palmeiro, and Jason Giambi. All of these players have admitted to and have been found guilty of using some kind of steroid.

Two of these players, Bonds and McGwire, broke Roger Maris' homerun record (61) in different seasons, hitting 70+ homeruns. Both records now have been seriously eye-balled because of the steroid allegations brought against both players. Some people say that there should be an asterisk next to the record. In my opinion an "RX" drug symbol should be put next to them or they should be taken out all together. Maris broke the record without any help and these players didn't deserve the advantage.

John falls in love with Claire, which is totally against the rules of wedding crashing. She turns out to be engaged, but John will not give up until he gets her.





Surprising News about SATs

Some Colleges Begin Phasing Out the Feared Exam

Wouldn't it be nice for high school students to concentrate on *just* their school work and grades, rather than what SAT preparation class they're going to sign up for or what day they are taking the test? Good news for future college-goers is on its way... many colleges and universities across the nation are following the new trend of making SAT I, SAT II,

and ACT test scores optional for student admissions.

Drew University. Mount Holyoke College, the College of Holy Cross, Bates College, Middlebury College, Bowdoin College, Hamilton College, and many more have taken action in making standardized test scores optional. This, however, does not mean that students cannot submit their test scores. Submitting or not submitting will have

no affect on the school's decision and view of you as a student.

In place of extensive screening of test scores, schools like the ones mentioned above, will be a close evaluation of high school records. Admission officers will be looking at the academic record, rigor of the curriculum, class rank (if available), comments from teachers and counselors, written responses on an application, and possible personal interviews.

Admission processes have been discussed and debated over the past several years. Numerous colleges and universities feel that they should place a far greater weight on the academic

experiences of an applicant rather than a single test. According to the College of Holy Cross, "schools hope that this change will help redirecting attention back to what really matters: day-today performance in the classroom."

Bates College found an increase in application rates from students of different races, nationalities, backgrounds, and disabilities. Many

educational professionals hope this change will bring new diversity to college and university campuses, bettering students for the future.

"The SAT does not measure intellectual range and motivational qualities that our educational environment requires." "SAT scores presently, in fact, carry only about 10% of the weight in admission decisions," stated the Admissions Office at Mount Holyoke. "The College encourages high school students to focus instead on long-term intellectual and personal growth rather than on time-consuming and expensive strategies to raise their SAT scores."

Drew University publicized

the following statement, "We feel this action will encourage students to focus more on what a liberal arts education has to offer them and less on test scores."

It has become eminent that the schools aforementioned are all along the same lines: have students concentrate on high school educations rather than a single test that may be a waste of their time. This new decision will make many students happy and will hopefully ease the process of college decision-making.

Equality can now be found throughout all high schools. Some students test better than others on standardized tests and should not be punished for their inability. Apprehensiveness and anxiousness can be wiped off students' shoulders as they continue in high school, some not even worrying about SATs. The decision is now up to the student: take the SATs or attend a school that makes test scores optional.

The question now is... will more and more colleges and universities be following this trend? Who knows. But by the time the younger generations will be attending college, SATs may be unheard of and a thing of the past. Wouldn't that be nice?





Hurricane Katrina Devastates Louisiana

Rita Follows, Delivers Harsh Blow

You all may know Katrina as the monstrous Category 4 hurricane that caused massive destruction to the Gulf Port area this past August. However, Katrina didn't just appear

out of nowhere as a Category 4 hurricane; like every other hurricane, there was a period of time during which Katrina gained its enormous strength.


On August 23, the U.S. National Hurricane Center reported that Tropical Depression Twelve had formed over the southeastern Bahamas from

the remains of Tropical Depression Ten. The depression was upgraded to Tropical Storm Katrina on the morning of August 24. On August 25, Katrina became the fourth hurricane 2005 of the season, landfall making later that day as a Category 1 hurricane around 6:30 P.M. between Hallandale Beach and Aventura Florida.

As Katrina passed over land on August 26 it weakened back down to a tropical storm before growing to a Category 2 hurricane with winds up to one hundred mph. This was when it became clear that

she was headed straight for Mississippi and Louisiana. As a result, President George Bush declared a state of emergency in Louisiana, Alabama, and Mississippi.

On August 27,



the storm was upgraded to an intense Category 3 hurricane, which is classified as a "major hurricane." On the following day, it grew even stronger graduating to a Category 4. On this day, Katrina gained its full strength in a very short period of time. At this time Katrina's had some frightening statistics. had maximum sustained winds strengthening to 175 mph, gusts of 215 mph and a central pressure of 23.64 inches. It became the fourth most intense Atlantic Basin hurricane on record.

Katrina finally made landfall again on August

29, near Buras-Triumph, Louisiana, as a Category 4 hurricane with winds up to 140 mph. A few hours later, it made landfall for a third time near the border of Louisiana and Mississippi with Category 3 winds at 125 mph. This is when it caused the most destroving destruction. everything in its path, including innocent residents who chose not to evacuate.

Thereafter, Katrina lost hurricane-strength as it moved more inland. It was downgraded back to a tropical depression near Clarksville, Tennessee and continued to travel northward. Katrina's last known position was southeast Ouebec over and northern New Brunswick on August 31.

Katrina's lowest minimum pressure landfall was 27.11 inches, making it the third strongest hurricane on record to make landfall in the United States. The thirty-foot storm surge at Biloxi, Mississippi, which is the water that is pushed toward the shore by the force of the winds swirling around the storm, was the highest ever recorded in America. Currently, the National Hurricane Center is considering reclassification Hurricane Katrina on the Saffir-Simpson scale to a Category 5 storm at landfall.



from the cities. It is expected that hundreds, if not thousands, more corpses are covering 40% of the city beneath the floodwaters.

Coast Guard Vice Adm. Thad W. Allen said the recovery's slow start was because "access was made difficult by weather and lack of communication." Thankfully, it is moving along now with Senate providing emergency housing for more than 350,000 who were left homeless.

Congress is moving to pass a new bill that would expand Medicaid, unemployment and welfare benefits for Katrina's evacuees. It would cost from \$5 billion to \$7 billion through 2006.

Overall, relief efforts are currently in full swing to help the victims of this tragedy. It will undoubtedly take a lot of time and money, but America will pull through.




