

Fockey team played Ewing in the opening round of the NJSIAA Central Jersey Group II Tournament on Saturday October 31st, winning 3-1 over the Ewing Blue Devils.

The sixth-seeded Warriors scored three goals in the second half over the eleventh-seeded Blue Devils.

After a scoreless first half, freshman Kaitlynn Anderson scored nine minutes into the second half giving the team a one point

advantage.
Junior, Erin Healy sent a cross pass to senior Laura Phillips, who then passed the ball over to Anderson who
cracked it in the goal right past the goalie's left leg.

With ten minutes left in the game, the Warriors scored a very important goal.

A long hit by junior Claire Toole was made to Kaitlynn Anderson, who continued rushing down the side line passing it to senior Toniann Fernandez, Fernandez quickly sent it to Phillips, Phillips settled it and sank the shot in for her first, but not last goal of the game.

Ewing, trying to stay alive in the game, responded with a goal on a penalty corner two minutes after Phillips's goal.

Then, with about three minutes left in the game, Phillips scored her second goal.

A beautiful pass combination between senior Colette

Sabins, and junior Kendall Miller, moved the ball down the

field. Sabins flew the pass over to Phillips, who drew the goalie

out of the cage. With full control, Phillips pushed the ball right

into the goal, making her second goal of the game.

After this exciting goal, the Manasquan Warriors
 snagged their win over the Ewing Blue Devils. This win saved



the Warriors to move on to the next round and at the same time, knock the Blue Devils right out of the tournament.

In round two of the NJSIAA Central Jersey Group II Tournament, our sixth-seeded Manasquan Warriors played the number third-seeded Collingswood Panthers, on Tuesday November 3rd.

Sadly, our Warriors lost to the Panthers 3-1, ending their season. Senior Laura Phillips, scored the Warriors' only goal to tie the

game in the first half at 1-1.

Warrior goalie senior Alicia Lyons made eight saves, as the Warriors were outshot 12-9.

"We came out hard in the first half and played well" in the second half" began Warriors' Coach Cosse, "we just couldn't find the cage. We missed shots, and didn't execute on corners. We made some mistakes in the backfield, but overall, we just couldn't finish. I didn't expect to go far in states, but this was not how I wanted the season to end either, against a team we could have beaten." Cosse ended.

After having a shakey start and a well played season,
the Manasquan Warriors finished with season record of 8-62, by winning to the eleventh-seeded Ewing Blue Devils, and
losing to the third-seeded Collingswood Panthers. an NJSIAA
Central Jersey Group II Tournament record of 1-1.

Our Warrior Fockey team, is looking forward to an exciting season next year. 



This organization started in 2006 as founder Jamie Tworkowski's effort to tell a story to help a friend. The story was entitled "To Write Love on Her Arms", thereby providing the groups name.

To Write Love On Her Arms (or TWLOHA for short) is based in Key West, Florida but is designed to connect people to treatment centers, webistes, books, and support groups nationwide. They try to bridge the gap between traditional treatment and the lives of the individuals.

TWLOHA hosts many festivals and concert tours while updating their social networking sites, and visiting schools and universities - all to promote the message of hope.

An online store is also available, containing Shirts, Hoodies, Totes, and more for both girls and boys. Most of the designs are special collaborations or case specific featured items.

Some collaborations include a T-shirt incorporating the band Forever The Sickest Kids they call 'Forever Love', the 'New Filled Tank' Chiodos design, and the 'Casey Shirt' honoring the life of Hawthorne Heights guitarist Casey Calvert.

In addition to inspiring shirt designs, musicians offer a lot of support to the group. The receive celebrity endorsements from Paramore, Switchfoot, The Blackout, Mayday Parade, Panic at the Disco, The Rocket Summer, Fireflight, Underoath, The Almost, Bayside, As We Collide, The Red Jumpsuit Apparatus, Fresno, and many more.

A Skylit Drive, as well as Between the Trees, have gone as far as writing a song about Renee Yohe, the Subject of the To Write Love on Her Arms story.

The TWLOHA Facebook is also a popular way for the group to get in touch with their supporters. The organization had an excess of over 233,000 fans. More than any other foundation of it's kind.

and 'SwiftKaroteChop' promote them through their subscribers as well.

The momentous popularity of the organization is one of the reasons that they can reach so many people and offer help and services to so many of those suffering.

The week of September 10th to 17th has been named 'To Write Love on Her Arms Week'. People around the world celebrate this by writing 'Love' on their arms, in marker or otherwise.

Unfortunately, Miss. Congilose's grandmother was diagnosed with Alzheimer's five years ago and had just recently passed away. This tragedy has given Miss. Congilose the motivation to plan a walk called Memory Walk '09. This walk was on September 26, 2009 at Littler Silver Park in Point Beach.

Hoping to continue this tradition here at Manasquan High School, Miss. Congilose was very pleased with the outcome of her walk. They finished the walk with having around four hundred people show up and surpassed their goal

of raising a thousand dollars for their first year.

Along with Miss. Congilose, there is Mrs. Fenlon. She has a Bachelor's Degree in Literature in Secondary Education. Having four years experience, she teaches English I, English II, and a Writing course. She is the National Honor Society and Sophomore Class Advisor.

"Every year we like to hold this uplifting experience to continue the tradition of thankfulness," Mrs. Fenlon explains.

Mrs. Fenlon is continuing her tradition for three years now. This year was a huge success for Manasquan and Communications High School. Everyone was able to connect with the children that deal with Down's syndrome.

Overall, there were fifty volunteers that showed up to help with the walk. The walk was held on October 3, 2009 at the Atlantic Club in Manasquan. Confident it'll maintain good progress for many years to come, Mrs. Fenlon was also very happy with the outcome.

The last of the teachers is Miss. Reidy. She came here, Manasquan High School, to attend high school which proves that an MHS student can make a difference. She graduated

from Salve Regina University with a double major in History and Secondary Education. In 2006, she taught World History at Jackson Memorial High School and later transferred to Point Pleasant Beach High School, teaching US History I, US History II, and World History. Miss. Reidy has just started teaching here in the first month of 2009 as an educator in Sociology and US History I.

The certain walk that Miss. Reidy participated in was held on September 26, 2009 in Avon. This walk benefited ovarian cancer and was run by the Kaleidoscope of Hope.

"It was fun and nice day. It was fun to be with my friends and raising awareness," she said. "This was my first year in this walk, but I've been participating in walks for 10 years. I will definitely be doing it again."

Her college roommate's cousin died from ovarian cancer four years ago which is one of the many reasons why she was involved in this walk.

Even though younger women, like the cousin of Miss. Reidy's roommate, can have ovarian cancer, this "silent killer" of a cancer is usually found in women over fifty years old. According to the American Cancer Society, women diagnosed in the earliest stages have a five-year survival rate of nearly ninety-three percent.

As seen by these three caring teachers, walking can be used for many other reasons than just for a workout or getting from one place to another. Thinking out side of the box, Miss. Congilose, Mrs. Fenlon, and Miss. Reidy have all participated in a walk for a cause. By doing this, their actions have motivated many others, young and old, to do the same.
