

Having very strong players this year, Mrs. Certo loves coaching this great group of girls. "They are always playing together," she says.







Upon arrival, I saw a plain concrete building with a simple banner

The menu is large but not overwhelmingly large, it ranges from Manicotti to Sauteed Calamari. The price



The Bamboozle festival was created in 2003 by a man no one knows much about but goes by the name of 'Willy'. The first two bamboozle festivals were not even close to the magnitude they are today.

They started right here at the Jersey shore at our very own Stone Pony and moved to the Asbury Convention Hall in 2005 due to its high demands.

Realizing the festival's popularity the creators of the event were subjected to holding the event in the Medowlands Sports Complex (the parking lot of giants stadium.

The months leading up to Bamboozle are almost as exciting as the festival itself thanks to the help of 'The Characters'.

The festival was surrounded by a series of merch tents varing from the Keep-A-Breast (I < 3 Boobies) foundation to the popular clothing line Glamour Kills.


The performer that stirred up the most attention (whether bad or good) was the 'Tik Tok' pop star



Da'Ron tells us that he inspires himself, and gets his creative fashion from his mom and dad who are also "very fashionable" as well.



Massive Oil Spill Threatens Gulf

"Potentially Unprecedented Environmental Disaster"

Let's spill. I've got gossip, but this kind is different. The difference is that we don't want to hear it. It's the kind that really damages our Earth and weighs down on us by about 210,000 gallons a day.

On April 20, 2010, an explosion occurred. This explosion was a spill of oil right on the Gulf of Mexico. Unfortunately, there was a burst on the Deepwater Horizon oilrig. When this took place, workers happened to be there and, sadly, eleven of them died and seven were injured.

The Deepwater Horizon was worth to be more than 560 million dollars. The mess it made charged more than 12.5 billion dollars. We have started to pay it off, but it is going to take quite awhile.

This 2010 oil spill was said to leak about 1,000 barrels of oil each day, but now it has risen to about 210,000 gallons. These gallons started to and still are moving towards Louisiana. Also, it is escaping

5,000 feet under water.

The weather is also affecting the direction and amount of the oil moving in on other areas. The wind was pushing it to the other direction away from the current which could easily have a worse effect. As the wind dies down, it is allowing operations to take place in order to capture some of the oil. This will help the oil stay away from coastal shellfish breeding grounds.

The government has come up with a few ideas in order to clean up the spill. Their first attempt was to create a dome. This dome is a box that's about 98 tons that has an opening at the top which will collect the oil. This idea unfortunately failed because the opening was becoming clogged with gas hydrates.

The government is still concluding plans to help this disaster out. We, unfortunately, are still dealing with the other spill that occurred in Kuwait in 1999. All we can do is hope that we can fix this disaster before it turns into anything worse.

Sustainable Living Sustainable living refers to one



perfect ending to the perfect year.


